# New Mural for New Playground In Lower East Side School Campus

**LOWER EAST SIDE, NY** – In partnership with The Trust for Public Land (TPL) and PS 15 The Roberto Clemente School campus, Groundswell inspired stewardship of the environment in youth artists through the artistic transformation of the East Village school campus playground. The mural depicts the Habits of the Mind educational philosophy, which describes sixteen intellectual habits to solve a problem such as persistence, creativity, and interdependence.

This mural, "The Power of Flourishing Minds," will be unveiled Thursday, August 27 at 1 pm.

The Groundswell team, working with Lead Artist Angel Garcia and Assistant Artist Jessica Angel, researched, designed, and fabricated this mural as part of Groundswell's flagship program, the Summer Leadership Institute. "The youth involved had a huge voice during this project," Claire Haviland, one of the participants on the mural, said about the process. "It has made a significant impact on the responsibility we feel we hold as young people and members of our community."

Installed across two walls in the playground, the mural design reflects upon the values highlighted in the PS 15 The Roberto Clemente School's Habit of the Mind philosophy. These values are juxtaposed with imagery celebrating the environmental stewardship mission provided by TPL. The central image of one wall is a figure with arms outstretched, emphasizing the young people's vision of the idea of reaching for your goals. Vines and leaves hold the images together, to further reflect upon the idea of nature and the concept behind unity, interconnection, and network. The second wall aims to inspire both young and old alike to strive for success, using vibrant images such as a nest composed of hands, a Phoenix bird, and a turtle with a maze for a shell.

"To ensure healthy development in our students, PS 15 uses the Habits of the Mind curriculum, which encourages youth to practice sixteen pragmatic every-day values. With the creation of this inspiring new mural, we can bring these habits to the community," said Irene Sanchez, Principal of PS 15 The Roberto Clemente School.

"Throughout the mural-making process, the youth engaged nature as a tool for learning, inspiration, and creativity," said TPL Executive Director and Chief Executive Officer William Rogers. "They have become ambassadors for environmental stewardship through this collaboration, and 'The Power of Flourishing Minds' will ensure healthy, livable communities for generations to come."

"At Groundswell, we believe that art is a tool for making lasting change in a community," said Groundswell Executive Director Rob Krulak. "This mural is an engaging roadmap to the Habit of the Mind curriculum practiced by the committed teachers and staff at PS 15, and promises to serve as a touchstone for the school and its students as they explore their potential."
